- The director general shall perform his function under supervision of Federal government.
- Director general has the power to make regulations..
- Federal government delegate all the powers to director general except under section 11.
- In case of military assistance all the members and officers shall function according to the direction of military authority.
- Director general means commander incharge ASF.
- Officer and members of ASF are subject to Army act 1952.
- A member of ASF is dismissed if punished (sentenced for imprisonment) for 90 days.
- Suspension is on 3 grounds.
- Misconduct,remissness and negligence.
- Revision against to Federal govt shall be in 30 days.
- Appeal time period 30 days.
- The director general delegate all or any of the powers to any officers and authority subordinate to him.
- If a member of ASF is deserter the civil authorities will be requested to capture the deserter.
- The form of affirmation shall be signed in the presence of Director general

- or other enrolling officer.
- Airport security ordinance number was:12
- Director general shall take prior approval of Federal govt to delegate powers to any officer or authority.
- Section 8 deals with indemnity clause.
- No suit or proceeding shall run against the act done in good faith by ASF force.
- Federal government shall sanctioned the cadre strength to the Director General.
- The deserter or member absents without leave shall be brought before the magistrate without delay.
- No authority,tribunal or court shall alter,vary,modify,alter,annul,set aside, revise or review any order passed by any officer of the force.
- Force means the Airport security force constituted under section 3.
- Air side means the movement area of aerodrome,adjacent terrain and building and area which is controlled by force.
- ASF stands for airport security force .
- Extend to all aerodromes,airports,all civil aviation station,centres or offices in Pakistan,
- Headquarter if Airport security force is in Karachi.
- Its HQ was established in 1976.
- Director general ASF:Major General Adnan Asif Jah Shad
- Aviation Division is headed by : Aviation Secretary
- ASF is under the supervision of Aviation division.
- Rules will be made by federal govt while regulations by Director general.
- An official of ASF can arrest a suspect attempting to endanger without warrant.
- Airside is term that is used for movement of an aerodrome,adjacent terrain and buildings that is controlled by ASF.
- Aerodrom is an area of land and water used for the purpose of landing,departure and movement of an aircraft.
- ASF service rules framed in 1978.
- ASF function is to safeguard the aviation industry unlawful interference,adopt counter terrorism measure,preventing crime and maintain law within the limits of airports in Pakistan.

**Statutory Notification (S.R.O.)**

**GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN**

**MINISTRY OF DEFENCE**

**(Aviation Division)**

**NOTIFICATIONS**

*Rawalpindi, the 20th April, 1978*

**S.R.O. 433 (I)/78.**—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Airports Security Force Act, 1975 (LXXVII of 1975), the Federal Government is pleased to make following rules, namely : —

**1. Short title, commencement and application.**—(1) These rules may be called the Officers and Members of the Airports Security Force (Service) Rules, 1978.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

(3) They shall apply to all officers and members where ever they may be.

**2. Definitions.**—In these rules, unless, there is any thing repugnant in the subject or context,--

a. “Act” means the Airports Security Force Act, 1975 (LXXVII of 1975) ;

b. “Grade” means the National Scale of Pay in which a post or group of posts is placed ; and

c. “Unit” means a detachment of the Force entrusted with the responsibility of security of an airport.

**3. Headquarters of the Force**—(1) The headquarters of the Force shall be at such place as the Federal Government may by order appoint.

(2) The units may be posted at such airports as the Federal Government may, by order in writing, direct.

**4. General Supervision of the 1[Federal Government].—** The Director General shall exercise his powers and perform his functions under the general supervision and direction of Federal Government who:-

- (a) shall be responsible to the Federal Government for administration of the Force in accordance with the Act and any rules, orders or instructions made or issued by that Government from time to time ;
- (b) shall exercise all financial powers relating to it ; and may, from time to time, issue such directions to the 2[Director General] and officers as he thinks necessary.

**5. Duties of the 2[Director General].--**The Director General shall be the administrative head of the Force and:-

- (a) shall be in command and control of the Force ;
- (b) shall be responsible to the 1[Federal Government] in respect of all matters concerning the force and the exercise of his administrative functions under section 5 of the Act ;
- (c) may, by general or special order, assign duties to the officers and members.
- (d) shall be responsible for the maintenance of its discipline ; and
- (e) shall take such measures for the training of its officers and members as are necessary.

**6. Duties of officers and members.—**All officers and members of the Force shall comply with the orders of their superior officers and perform such duties as may from time to time be assigned to them by the 2[Director General.]

**7. Additional Directors to be Chief Security Officers.—** 2[An Additional Director] appointed to a Unit shall be the Chief Security Officer of the airport at which the Unit is posted, and :-

- (a) shall be responsible to the 2[Director General] in respect of all matters concerning his Unit, including the discipline and training of its officers and members.
- (b) shall be in command of his Unit ; and
- (c) may, by general or special order, assign duties to officers and members.

**8. Composition of the Force.—**The Force shall consist of the following officers and members with the designation and grade shown against each namely:-

- (i) 2[Director General BPS-21].
- (ii) Deputy Director General (BPS-20) with Rs.400/- per month as special pay].
- (iii) 3[(Directors (BPS-20).
- (iv) Additional Directors (BPS-19).
- (v) Deputy Director (BPS-18).
- (v) Assistant Director (BPS-17)].
- (vi) Inspectors (BPS-16).
- (vii) Sub-Inspectors (BPS-14).
- (viii) 4[Assistant Sub-Inspectors (BPS-11).
- (ix) Sergeants (BPS-9).
- (x) Corporals (BPS-7).]

**9. Authority to make appointment.**—(1) The authority competent to make appointment in the Force to Grade 17 and above shall be the Advisor for the Establishment Division.

(2) The authority competent to make appointments in the Force to Grades 1 to 16 shall be the 1[Director General].

**10. Method of appointment.**—(1) Appointment to posts in the Force shall be made by any of the following methods, namely:--

- (a) by promotion or transfer ; or 2[Secondment or Induction] or
- (b) by initial appointment.

(2) The methods of appointment and qualifications and other conditions applicable to a post shall be as laid down by the Aviation Division in consultation with the establishment Division. 3[Annexure]

**11. Persons not eligible for appointment.**—No persons shall be appointed to the Force who:-

- (a) has married a foreign national ;
- (b) is not a citizen of Pakistan ;
- (c) was discharged from any defence force or civil service on disciplinary grounds ; or
- (d) has not attained the minimum laid down physical standards laid down in accordance with sub-rule (2) of rule 10.

**12. Seniority.**—(1) A seniority list shall be drawn up and maintained in respect of all officers and members.

(2) A person appointed to a grade shall count his seniority from the date on which he is appointed to that grade.

(3) If more persons than one or appointed to a grade by initial appointment on the same date, their inter se seniority shall be fixed on the basis of their merits determined after any test or examination held on completion of their initial training.

(4) A person appointed to a grade by initial appointment shall be junior to a person appointed to that Grade by promotion or transfer on the same date.

(5) Persons appointed to a Grade by promotion on the same date shall count their inter seniority from the date of their appointment to the lower Grade from which they were promoted.

(6) Persons appointed to a Grade by transfer from the same department on the same date shall retain their seniority of that department.

(7) If a person is appointed to a Grade by promotion and another by transfer on the same date, the person who is appointed by promotion shall rank senior to a person who is appointed by transfer.

(8) A person appointed to a Grade on an officiating or regular basis shall be senior to the person appointed to the same Grade on ad hoc or contract basis.

**13. Confirmation.**—Confirmation of officers and members shall be subject to fitness and availability of permanent vacancies in the Force.

**14. Age of superannuation.**—The age of superannuation of the officers and members shall be sixty years.

**15. Confidential reports.**—Annual confidential reports of the officers shall be written and endorsed by officers superior to them in accordance with the instructions issued by the Director General.

**16. Validity of appointments made before commencement of these rules.**—All appointment to the Force before the commencement of these rules shall be deemed to have been made in accordance with, and subject to, these rules.

**17. Resignation.**—(1) No officer or member shall resign from the Force, without giving in writing a notice of two months.

Provided that a person may at any time resign with the prior permission of the appointing authority.

(2) A person who after tendering his resignation and before its acceptance by the appointing authority absents himself from duty without reasonable cause or without prior permission of his superior officer shall be liable to disciplinary action.

**18. Allowances.**—All officers and members shall be governed by the terms and conditions laid down by the Federal Government from time to time for its officers and staff in addition, be entitled to the following allowances, namely :-

**19. Leave.**— All officers and members shall be entitled to such leave and other privileges as are admissible to the Federal Government servants.

20. **Pension.**—All officers and members shall be governed by the pension rules applicable to the Federal Government servants.

21. **Maintenance of accounts.**—The accounts of the Force will be maintained by the Accountant General Pakistan Revenues.

22. **Drawing and Disbursing Officers.**—The 1[Director General] and the Chief Security Officers shall appoint Drawing and Disbursing Officers at the Headquarters and the Units, respectively.

23. **Imprest Account.**—(1) There shall be maintained an Imprest Account at the headquarters and the Units by such officers and subject to the approval of the Federal Government as the 1[Director General] may direct.

(2) The officer appointed to maintain the Imprest Account shall exercise such powers as are exercised by an officer of the Federal Government in respect of the Imprest Account.

24. **Audit.**—All accounts of the Force shall be audited by the Auditor-General of Pakistan.
